The Second Lesson

2 Cor. 1:3-7

A Reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation, who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God. For just as the sufferings of Christ are abundant for us, so also our consolation is abundant through Christ. If we are being afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation; if we are being consoled, it is for your consolation, which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we are also suffering.

Our hope for you is unshaken; for we know that as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our consolation.

Canticle 17. The Song of Simeon

Luke 2:29-32

Mary Magdalene:

Mary Magdalene is mentioned in the Gospels as being among the women of Galilee who followed Jesus and His disciples, and who was present at His Crucifixion and Burial, and who went to the tomb on Easter Sunday to anoint His body. She was the first to see the Risen Lord, and to announce His Resurrection to the apostles. Accordingly, she is referred to in early Christian writings as "the apostle to the apostles."

Of the 3 women of Galilee who followed Jesus, (Mary of Bethany, an unnamed women and Mary Magdalene, Mary Magdalene was presumed to be a former prostitute (Luke 8:2) that "Jesus had cast seven demons out of her "(Luke 8:2). She was considered a "Spectacular sinner", that Jesus healed of body and mind. (Satucket Lectionary)
